



Seeking Community Navigators!

The Access to Justice & Law Reform Institute is seeking African Nova Scotian Community Navigators for its project on wills and estates.

Community Navigators will receive a half-day training on the importance of making a will, estate planning documents, and information on what happens if you die without a will. Navigators will additionally receive a certificate of completion after the project is complete.

Navigators will assist engaging community members to attend a session within their community, on wills and estates and the law. They will be responsible for contacting community members for their area and assisting with organizing the set up.

Navigators will receive a \$500 honourarium for the training and \$500 for assisting to organize the community session.

We will be holding a series of consultation across the province, which will require 6 African Nova Scotian navigators from the following historic communities (area);

1. Beechville, Hammonds Plains, Lucasville
2. Halifax (HRM)
3. Preston Townships, Lake Loon, Cherry Brook
4. Truro, Amherst, New Glasgow
5. Sydney, Glace Bay
6. Shelburne, Yarmouth, Digby
